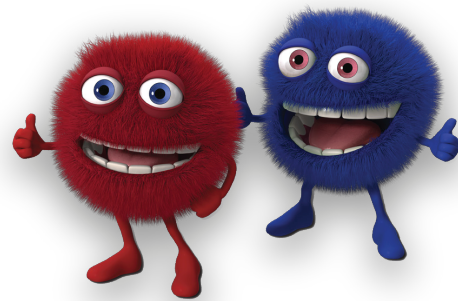



















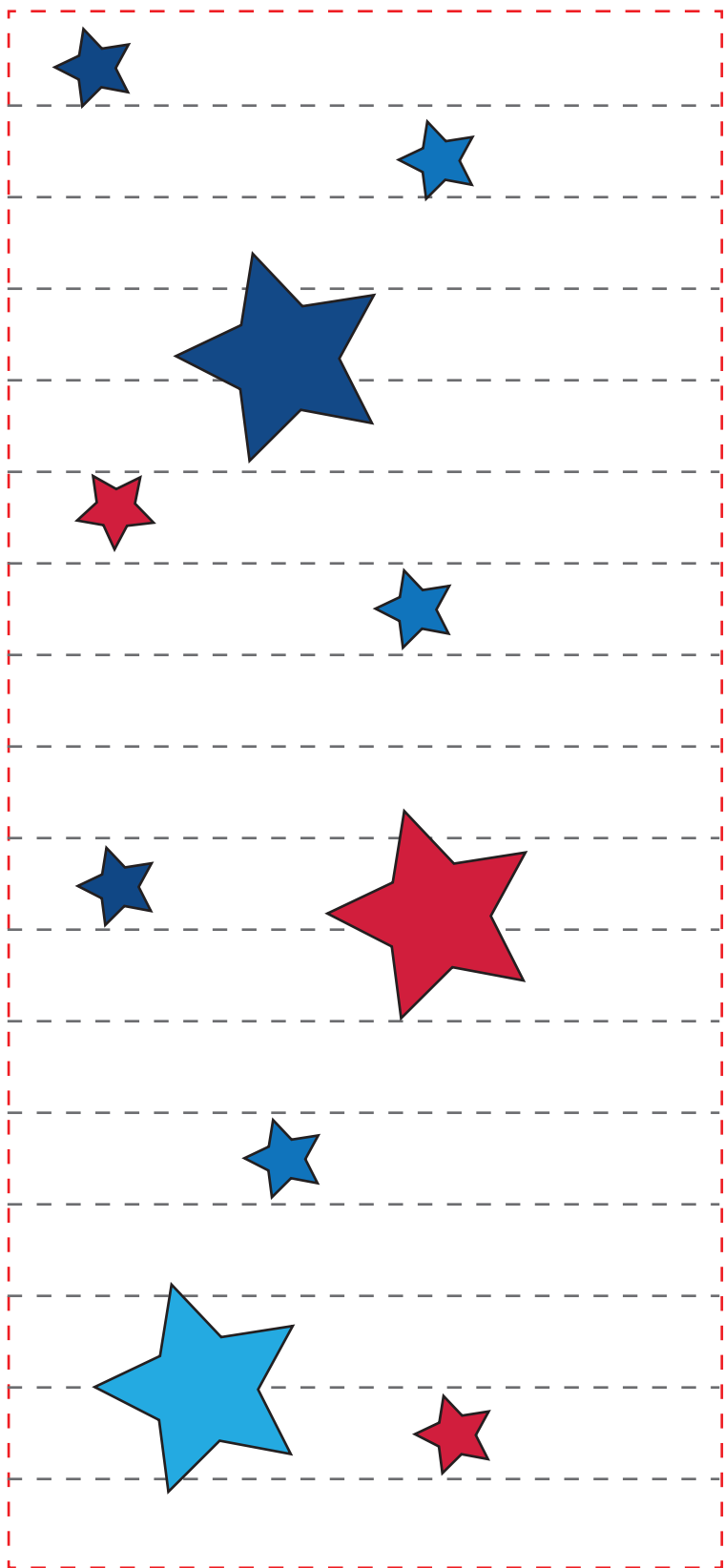


Make Your Own
4TH OF JULY FAN





Directions:

Print these 2 pages.

Cut around the outside red line of each block on the red dotted line.

Accordion fold each of the panels along the black dotted lines.

Once folded, cut the large panel (first page) in half at dotted line.

You should have 3 accordion panels when done.

Line each of the 3 accordion panels side-by-side to create one long piece.

Tape them all together along the top so they are connected

Refold the panels, then staple the bottom corners together to create the accordion fan.

Tape or glue a wooden skewer to the outside panel of each side of your fan, below where you have your tape (see photo.)

To open fan, bring the two ends of the skewers together.

Optional: Cover your tape area with a ribbon or yarn to hide the tape and make a streamer.
